New Amex Card HA-19-5-23

I am happy to report that I received the new American Express card and shall inform the New Mexico Regulation & Licensing Department and Treasury, when it has been used to buy new shoes, shop for groceries and withdraw cash from an ATM, this afternoon. I will visit Santa Fe some other time. I prematurely wrote this letter to elicit permission from the New Mexico Regulation & Licensing Department to be emailed to my personal, smart-phone accessible email. This email should grant American Express permission to mail my replacement American Express card to the address above, so I could pick it up in person, identified by my passport card, in case, as

commonly occurs in embezzlement cases, the letter is stolen from the mail, when I get there, in about four days, with access to a routine shuttle ride to Santa Fe, New Mexico. I perhaps wrote this confidential letter too soon, but I am convinced the Democratic southern border states of New Mexico, Arizona and California need to stop discriminating against American Express, to rival the Bureau of Fiscal Service monopolized Visa and Mastercard franchises comprising the Direct Express and Netspend (DEN) of Inequity in Austin, Texas.

I am provisionally advising the director of the New Mexico Regulation & Licensing Department to order: American Express be accepted anywhere Visa and Mastercard are, pursuant to the Uniform Money Services Act. I am sorry to burden you with this obsession that is preventing me from strengthening the legislation justifying a wide-variety of recounts of obvious federal overestimates, most significantly the 2020 and 2022 voter-turnout and 2020 payroll and 2021 and 2022 income taxes and customs revenues, not to mention academic population and GDP statistics, in the Echinacea Recount Agenda, being written at the stately pace of the Continental Divide Trail. I will be sure to email this same email list with the outcome of the snail mail delivery, in four or five days. Permission from New Mexico Regulation & Licensing to hand-deliver me, my American Express card would be construed as good faith, and serve as firm ground for the enforcement of the Uniform Money Service Act in behalf of American Express, after the confidential outcome of the mail delivery is known.

I am hiking the Continental Divide Trail from the Mexican border to Canada and had to pass through Lordsburg twice after the bus driver from El Paso refused to drop me off at Deming, so I could walk 50 miles to the only thriving border crossing in the comparatively non-violent, fraudulent land deal of New Mexico. After an embezzlement attempt for which American Express froze my card and sent me a new one, I am writing to complain that two out of three merchants and the bank in Lordsburg were unable to accept American Express cards. The first cashier to require cash, at Saucedo grocery store, explained I was going to have trouble in New Mexico trying to use an American Express card.

Elsewhere, most merchants and ATMs accepted American Express. However, in Lordsburg merchants and members only bank, were profoundly unable to process American Express transactions, except at the ATM in the truck stop. American Express wrote an email to authorize the second transaction, the second cashier at Dollar General was unable to process, but my phone was off at the time, and I had already paid in cash, so I ignored the message. On my first pass through the racial drama of Lordsburg, on a Sunday, there was a strange, “homeless” African-American lady, with her belongings in a cart of her own, stationed outside the closed bank, in the hottest part of all day. A gentleman and I crossed the street to check on her when she was lying face down on the pavement. I mentioned her straw hat had a large hole in it and she said she was okay. Not dissimilar to how we find the Treasury Secretary's actions on the income floor of the Age Discrimination Act, regarding her loss of General Fund balance(s) to Bureau of Fiscal Service fraud..



Several weeks later, on a mesa above La Ventana Natural Arch, half a day before arriving in Grants, where there was cell reception, I received an email message from American Express informing me that there was a suspicious transaction. When I agreed that it was unauthorized transaction, they informed me that they would have to freeze my card. Two priceless transactions from unknown merchants had been followed by at least eight \$25 transactions from Google Services. When I got to Walmart in Grants my American Express card did not work. I called the number on the back of my card, as directed and the American Express fraud department, helped me purchase groceries and

withdraw \$200 from an ATM, before turning off my card. I called back later to purchase some shoes online, but the agent could not overrule the prior decision to turn off the card, although the official line is that the card is not turned off until the new card is authorized, however the repetitive Google Services charges, do justify the decision to preemptively turn off the card. In case of common mail theft in the course of embezzlement, the plan is to get permission from the New Mexico Regulation & Licensing Department, Financial Institutions Division, to enable American Express to mail the card to the New Mexico Department of Banking, in an envelope marked confidential, explaining that they have agreed to deliver the card contained in the envelope within an envelope, during my visit to their office in Santa Fe, around May 20, 2023. This however turned out to be unnecessary because the mail to Ghost Ranch worked fine and the Georgia O'keefe hangout is highly recommended for anyone vacationing or hoping to do some writing or creative work in New Mexico.

I find that the conduct of not accepting American Express cards is unsafe and unsound practice by a person licensed to engage in money transmission that creates the likelihood of material loss, insolvency or dissipation of the licensee's assets, or otherwise materially prejudices the interests of its customers as defined in the Uniform Money Services Act at NM Stat §58-32-102(BB). The director is authorized to examine a licensee or authorized delegate, if the director has reason to believe they are engaged in an unsafe or unsound practice or has violated or is violating the Uniform Money Services Act NM Stat §58-32-601. If the director determined that a violation of the Uniform Money Services Act, or of a rule or order, is likely to cause irreparable harm to the licensee, its customers or the public, the director may issue an order requiring the licensee or authorized delegate to cease and desist from the violation NM §

58-32-803 that may be construed as a consent order to presume innocence NM § 58-32-804. The order - in the state of New Mexico, anywhere Visa and Mastercard are accepted, American Express should also be accepted, without suspicion, pursuant to the Uniform Money Services Act.

The jobs of Treasury Secretary Yellen and the Chairman Powell of the Board of Governors the Federal Reserve are morally, as well as financially bankrupt, because of this second embezzlement of their unpaid, best available federal accountant, by, or due to the criminal negligence of the Senate Committee on Banking Housing and Urban Development. Having confirmed themselves instead of paying deposit insurance and/or appointing me Public Trustee, to fill one of two vacancies since 2015, the Federal Reserve is bankrupt and the Treasury is consequently incompetent to realize a \$1,070 billion transfer from General Fund balance to General Fund balance to compensate for 2021 and 2022 income tax and customs revenues overestimates, after paying \$200 billion for the 2020 payroll tax overestimate leaving the United States with only \$49 billion to pay for the April 15, 2023 tax refund. This is easily solved with \$535 billion Debt Held by the Federal Reserve, paying 4.75 percent interest in advance to resolve Federal Reserve bankruptcy, and repaying the entire loan FY 24 and continuing to pay down Debt Held by the Federal Reserve at a rate of 2 percent interest, to the satisfaction of the Historical Tables of the Office of Management and Budget pursuant to 31CFR§203.2.

The Treasury Secretary is obligated to prescribe regulations best calculated to protect the Government and individuals, who receive and/or engage in issuing those notes, from fraud and loss due to malfeasance of Senate Committee on Banking Housing and Urban Development 31USC§321(5)(A) (B). On second thought, I would like to sweeten the deal, to end all debt ceiling standoffs, by testifying that the \$535 billion loan would enable the Federal Reserve to not only liberate the \$1,070 billion equivalent of the \$1,070 billion 2021 and 2022 income tax overestimate, frozen in the Treasury balance, over two years, and the advance 4.75 percent interest payment would get Federal Reserve remittances out of bankruptcy. \$535 billion to be available to pay the FY 23 tax refund would be repaid with another \$535 billion from Presidential spending overestimates FY 24. Although liberating money tied up in income tax overestimate duplicate, does not really increase federal debt, treating the tax overestimate dispute as loan, that does retire as it is repaid, is due process of the several Bureau of Fiscal Service frauds that, failing to perform, cause Janet Yellen's habitual loss of balance, slightly more than \$1,070 billion this bankruptcy, to compel the Senate to issue the President a 210 day notice to replace the Treasurer pursuant to the Vacancy Act, if she does not cough up the missing trillion dollars of marketed Treasury securities, that is quite different number of zeros, than the equivalent amount of uncollected back income tax overestimates.

Ordering credit/debit card licensees and authorized delegates who accept Visa and Mastercard to accept American Express, without suspicion, would go a long way to promoting the Uniform Money Service Act in the relatively non-violent, asylum states of California, Arizona and New Mexico. The southern border is divided by the not-defame the corporation interests of the Visa and Mastercard Bureau of Fiscal Service monopolized Direct Express and Netspend of inequity in Austin, Texas, that embezzled thousands of depositors and short-changed millions of 'not a debit card' purchasers, at least in fall of 2021. Although it is not known if Texas discriminates against American Express, a witness at Camp Oasis, made it clear that merchants in southern California, and probably northern California, as well, where I once amicably resolved a similar bank fraud, without any mail theft, often discriminate against American Express. Besides at the southern border, I have not had any difficulty regarding American Express. It should not be difficult for American Express to be accepted anywhere Visa and Mastercard franchises are trusted. Neither my American Express card, nor my one pound bag of unpeeled Bunny

Love carrots, wrongly sold at Walmart in sealed bag, rather than perforated with a tie, made it five miles down the road, passed Western New Mexico Correctional Facility, without being slimed with gut wrenching anxiety.

I suspect that the root cause of the theft or embezzlement regarding American Express is related to overzealous customs enforcement at the southern border. Vice President Harris, in her Title 42 termination mobilization, must take care not to be found by the Ohio General Assembly, or other State legislature, to be so severely mentally ill, as to once again find that embezzlement equates with any sort of revenues, for anyone, and be convicted of mail theft switching a Direct Express card with student loan forgiveness in winter 2021. in reflection on her severe mental illness, after taking a commercial flight, Ms. Harris, now flying in private jets, is hoped to provide some insight into the disabling effect of Senator Sherrod Brown's "perm" on a family woman's, reputation ruining, use of disablingly poisonous weapons against household members who bear witness of government misconduct. "Semiconductor Sherrod's" half truths are extremely hazardous. Having officially covered up the DEN of inequity when confirming Chairman Powell, the Senate Committee on Banking Housing and Urban Development is above suspicion, they are convicted of financial terrorism.

At this time, the Treasury is mostly engaged in protecting the Government and individuals against loss due to fraud perpetrated by the Senate Committee on Banking Housing and Urban Development, and the most logical penalty, after this most recent frivolous attempt to finger SEC stock buybacks, is to make it clear that the 100 percent loan semiconductor subsidy, murdering Queen Elizabeth II, Damar Hamlin, spilling vinyl chloride on Palestine, Ohio, without compensation, and running on Silicon Valley Bank and other banks, stops at the current \$37-\$50 billion level, because the Ethics Committee, who once convicted Senator Brown, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Banking Housing and Urban Development of attempting to smuggle a deadly weapon into Congress, has ruled that the Semiconductor subsidy is so corrupt, the Committee must be minimally stripped of its authority regarding the Defense Production Act and stop advertising themselves with Intelligence and Defense in the statutes and its Chairman, Members and similarly prima-facie non-collecting conspirators, eg. Bureau of Fiscal Service and Student Financial Aid, be prosecuted for theft (unresolved but usually non-violent) and/or bribery (murder) of federal funds under 18USC§666 and 26USC§7214.

There were two instance of bribery in this case, involving the termination of title 42 and the Bipartisan Infrastructure bill. One, an increased armed customs with Army support presence was deemed necessary to cope with the self-made decision to terminate the ridiculous Title 42 provisions, that failed to inform migrants they were required to get an ineffective COVID vaccine , and military helicopters stalked hikers along the CDT, all the way to the depraved highway resurfacing in Lordsburg. Two, the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) was extremely rude to tar and feather the annual CDT migration, in April and May, pursuant to the often abused, and usually insolvent Bipartisan Infrastructure bill, when the left hand isn't embezzling to pay the Highway Trust Fund, although General Fund payments need to be directed via the Federal Highway Administration. NMDOT resurfaced the road walk through Lordsburg and Grants, where hikers and consumers were particularly harassed, and maybe one other place that escapes me. At least three people were killed and six others, including two police officers, were wounded, when an eighteen year old gunman, who was shot and killed, "randomly" opened fire at cars and homes in Farmington, New Mexico, on May 15, 2023. This shooting would seem to be incidental to the placement of no pedestrian signs, on both sides of the CDT road walk, in front of the police station in Grants, right next to a sign that issues a fine for unlawfully posting signs. A Forest Service truck driver told me to walk on the left side of the barrier, after I was dumbstruck at the corner for a few minutes. I was not harassed by the police. I was harassed by NMDOT.

To do the rampage shooting in Farmington, that injured two officers, amongst six others, two fatally, justice, the Municipal Court in Grants may fine NMDOT \$300 pursuant to the Post No Signs of Any Kind Notice, for obstructing Roosevelt St. with No Pedestrian signs, right in front of the police station, and warn them not to tar and feather the annual migration of conspicuously white CDT hikers in April and May. NMDOT is to be questioned regarding the reasoning, source and timing of the financing of their Bipartisan Infrastructure bill racket, to prove that the Hobbes Act is not moot in regards to construction projects under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill. Was this a spur of the moment aggravated identity theft of their accountant by the Senate Committee Banking, Housing and Urban Development,

whose Chairman made every penny of his life-time political capitol, in this way, or planned interference with the CDT migration by NMDOT, who is ordered to not tar and feather CDT road walks in peak season of April and May in New Mexico.

Vice President Harris, having ordered American Express be accepted anywhere Visa and Mastercard are accepted, should find that the overzealous customs enforcement at the southern border is piqued by the concept of American Express visas. Since 9-11 enhanced border security has resulted in waiting times of about 6 months to receive a 6 month tourist or family visit visa. US immigration is difficult to work with, heavily armed, irregular, racist and/or xenophobic, unreliable and asks for money to deny applications more often than approve them, so people have a long history of walking across the border, rather than being murdered while being denied entrance at approved crossings. The main problem seems to be that the extremely violent, incessantly Kennedy assassinating state of Texas, monopolizes the majority of land-crossing points from Mexico to the United States, and although refreshingly right, California's toleration of statelessness does not promote legal migration, and typical of most Democratic politics is maybe more subversively violent, fighting for what is right, in a slightly wrong way, than fighting right wing extremist style, confined as both large, tyrannical states are behind a border wall. The bus that passed through El Paso, Texas refused to drop me off at Deming, New Mexico, so I could walk fifty miles to a genuine border town and observe the border. This forgotten little Dollar Store, is the only border crossing in peaceful New Mexico. An unaccompanied minor died in detention.

The Vice President should find that more transportation and life-supported border crossings are needed in the peaceful states of New Mexico and Arizona to counteract the bipolar immigration politics of credible fear of Texas and statelessness of California, whose border walls have been universally condemned by the International Court of Justice. Having re-invested in peaceful New Mexico and Arizona asylum officers, actually constructing new border crossing-facilities with transportation, water and food contract support, there, the United States needs to expedite tourist and family visit visas for people who do not have any arrest warrants, with an appeal process for work, study, refugee status and citizenship, within a week, to compete with the minutes it takes Canada to issue immigration visas, to people who are not convicted of felonies or have any outstanding arrest warrants. It might take as long as a month to issue travel documents to a stateless person, biometrically identified, background checked and granted asylum against spam in their records. Communities on both sides of the border must be made comfortable with sustainable contracts for bilingual consular, transportation, trails, lodging, wifi, camping, food and water services, in the desert.



At Crazy Cook, the Chihuahua - New Mexico border, at the southern terminus of the CDT, there is neither a wall nor a crossing point. A crossing point there would require four wheel drive water and transportation support. I spoke with a group of men standing on the Mexican side of the border, in fluent Spanglish about the credible fear we all had about crossing the border. They said there were trails on the Mexican side of the border and are not racists. However, to pass through a check-point, with a visa, it seems one would have to hike more than fifty miles to Puerto Palomas in Mexico and

Columbus in the United States. They were equally afraid of being arrested as I, of the Aztec violence in Northern Mexico. It would not be difficult to procure a visa to make a round trip from Puerto Palomas to Crazy Cook. On the Pacific Crest Trail and CDT crossing into Canada, it is necessary to get a visa, but because there is no one to stamp the passport at the border, one reports to the consular authorities in the nearby town on arrival. Canada issues visas nearly instantly online. By comparison, it usually takes six months to pass the criminal background and vaccine update, with a voluntary recommendation for Pneumovax, that cures and prevents for 5-10 years 21 *Streptococcus* species including *S pneumoniae* and *S. pyogenes*, check for a visa to enter the United State, after appearing at a US embassy. A trail angel informed me that due to COVID Canada has not been issuing visas to pedestrians and cyclists and this policy needs to be reinterpreted to mean that pedestrians with visas, crossing on the trail, check in at the nearest town, now that the World Health Organization has lifted the pandemic emergency, tacitly conceding Echinacea cures COVID, RSV and flu, with appeal to the Supreme Court of Canada.

The Secretary of the Interior, Deb Haaland, is a member of the Pueblo of Laguna and a 35th generation New Mexican. She is the first Native American Cabinet Secretary, and we love her, although 30 x 30 is treason. A lawyer, from a military family, Interior went bankrupt her first year in office, due to being billed by Mining Health while dramatically increasing spending for Indian Affairs, just once, however nearly all the increase went to tribal law enforcement, compounded by an inability to declare undistributed offsetting receipt/profit, as I instruct, to know when to say when. In her second year in office she abetted President Biden's 30 x 30 treason to conserve 30 percent of land and water by 2030 although the United States currently conserves an estimated 34 – 39 percent of land and 26 percent of water. The United Nations Environmental Program adopted the 30 x 30 whereas they currently only protect about 17 percent of land and 10 percent of water. The moral is more land and water must be conserved. Conflict in Alaska, where 89.2 percent of land is conserved, regarding the Willow Project was resolved by requiring that more land from the Petroleum exploration lands be donated to conservation than are being exploited by the project. Alaskans like their wilderness.

To answer the question, it would seem Deb Haaland also betrayed her home state of New Mexico, where 40.6 percent of land, 31.6 million of 77.7 million acres are conserved, 29.4 percent federally and 11.2 percent by the state. The problem seems to be that although the USDA transfers the 188 million acres of National Forests to the Interior Department annually in the fine print of their budget, the Interior does not recognize them, nor state and local land, and is so preoccupied with their 485.6 million acres, as to license the President to engage in a New Mexico style fraudulent land deal, whereby environmentalists are corruptly encouraged to support a massive “fire-sale” that would reduce conserved land to only 30 percent by 2030, from, for instance, 40.6 percent in New Mexico, although this poses a conflict of interest with the moral to conserve more land and water, because development was, for the most part, the devil. The statistically insane Interior Department, similar to their need to declare their profit of undistributed offsetting receipts, used by the Treasury to reduce the deficit and pay the first agency expenses of the new fiscal year, to make sound financial decisions, is obligated to produce United States conservation statistics competitive with those compiled by Trust for Public Land City Parks Facts Report 2011, Natural Resources Council of Maine (NRCM).

New Mexico is one of six "majority-minority" states where non-Hispanic whites constitute less than half the population. As early as 1940, roughly half the population was estimated to be nonwhite. Prior to becoming a state in 1912, New Mexico was among the few U.S. territories that was predominately nonwhite, which contributed to its delayed admission into the Union. The largest ethnic group is

Hispanic and Latino Americans, according to the 2020 census they account for 47.7%, which is nearly half of the state's population. The majority of which are Hispanos of New Mexico and Mexican Americans. New Mexico has the fourth largest Native American community in the U.S., at over 200,000. Comprising roughly one-tenth of all residents, this is the second largest population by percentage after Alaska. Fraudulent land deals in New Mexico deserve some elaboration. Federal civilian and military officials abused their authority to sell land that wasn't theirs, and evict tenants who failed to pay rents and/or mortgages. A good example is the Tierra Amarilla Land Grant issued by Mexico in 1832 whereby all pastures, watering places, roads and forests were to remain common property of the entire community. Following the victory of the United States in the Mexican–American War (1846–48), the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo resulted in Mexico ceding its northern holdings to the U.S., including the territories of Mexican California, Texas, and New Mexico. The Americans were initially heavy-handed in their treatment of former Mexican citizens, triggering the Taos Revolt in 1847 by Hispanos and their Pueblo allies; the insurrection led to the death of territorial governor Charles Bent and the collapse of the civilian government established by Stephen W. Kearny. In response, the U.S. government appointed local Donaciano Vigil as governor to better represent New Mexico, and also vowed to accept the land rights of Nuevomexicans and grant them citizenship. However, in 1860 Congress held the Tierra Amarilla Land was private, not common. The United States Congress admitted New Mexico as the 47th state on January 6, 1912.

#### Agate Arrowheads

The museum quality, bloodstained, agate, crystal arrowhead, with the point slightly broken off, in the picture to the left, was submitted for a carbon date to Forest Service in Cuba, New Mexico, with a particularly fine sample of what looked like petrified juniper, so as not to cut a hole in my pocket. The crystal arrowhead on the right, that had been rejected and thrown into the fire, was submitted for a carbon date to the Hachita General Store where they had a display of turquoise from a nearby abandoned mine where all the gems had been replaced with broken glass. One of the greatest mysteries in the Americas is why the Pueblo, Maya and Mississippi cultures abandoned their urban

developments around 1300 AD, incidental to the rise of the cannibalistic Aztecs, centuries before European contact and colonization. I hypothesize that because Native Americans did not raise livestock, over-hunted and fished urban areas, dependent on the three sisters - corn, beans and squash, invented around 700 AD - for complete protein, were vulnerable to calcium, phosphorus and iron deficiencies, manifesting in weak teeth, bones and diarrhea, respectively. Compounded with sanitation and communicable disease issues, involving high density urban dwelling, when it became evident that it would be necessary for urban dwellers to cannibalize human beings to sustain adequate nutrition, these people, tiring of dabbling in human sacrifice, left the city to live a long life in the wilderness. Pre-contact Native Americans are reported to have usually lived more than 100 years unless killed by war or accident. The Museum of Anthropology and Paleontology at Ghost Ranch made it clear that the Pueblo Indians moved from the caves and mesas, to irrigate the river valleys, morphing into the tribes of today..
