(c)(2) Child social security number required; to be issued in case where (Arizona) state vital statistic rejection of right to a birth certificate for stateless US national (born at home with medical licensed midwife and documented by US passport) occurred, pursuant to recounts of births from 2009 high and historical most popular baby name under Art. 7 of the Convention on the Rights of the Child.'

(c)(3) Poorest families with children first, including migrants who are taxpayers or refugees, pursuant to the elimination of child poverty in the United States under Art. 10(c) of the Declaration on Social Progress and Development.

(d) \$110,000,000,000 are authorized to be appropriated for the fiscal year ending October 1, 2025 and every year thereafter.

data comes in, if there was not such great uncertainty regarding the probably undercounting of births since possibly overestimated 2007 high of 4.3 million.

(4) Census net overestimate of 1,932,847 (2000-2020) as adjusted by *Annual Estimates of the Resident Population for the United States, Regions, States, District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico: April 1, 2020, to July 1, 2024* totals, is nearly exactly equal to the 1,927,000 birth certificates estimated to have been unlawfully rejected using the notoriously conservative 4 million birthmark method. 2025 is the first year this arguably counted class in want of “belated birth certificates” and social security numbers turn 18. Social security must issue social security numbers for an estimated 1.9 million persons, currently under the age of 18, whose (home) birth certificate was rejected by the state vital statistics offices. SSA shall index “belated birth certificate social security numbers” by state of birth with a special indication to recount belated birth certificates by year of birth, and most popular baby name. State Vital Statistics Offices and Birth Certificate Registries must issue “belated birth certificates” by year of birth and archive them properly Art. 7 Convention on the Rights of the Child (1990).

reported a total of 3,531,905 square miles of land, 277,209 square miles of water and 3,809,114 square miles total. This is a difference of 4 square miles of land, 12,367 square miles of water, and 277,209 square miles total. 99.9% of the difference involves state water areas, greater than 5,159 square mile Island areas.

1.1 States, DC and Island Area

(a) US Census Bureau State Area Measurements and Internal Point Coordinates 2010, State by State, DC and Island Area land and water areas are not internally consistent. Total land and water does not add up exactly, after checking data entry twice. There is a margin of error of 7.3% in the land and water area totals reluctantly reported by the 2010 Census nationally without supporting documentation.
